- **10:00** Speaker: Frieda Looser Chocolate: Food of The Gods and Elixir of Empire

Three thousand years ago, the Olmecs of Central America drew strength from drinking chocolate made from cacao beans. The Maya civilization valued cacao beans as currency, and pottery vessels bearing the hieroglyph for cacao sustained the spirits of nobles in their tombs. Aztec Emperor Montezuma reportedly drank chocolate from a golden goblet, and in 1519 entertained the Spanish explorer Hernando Cortès. The knowledge of chocolate was carried by Spaniards to Europe where the 'divine drink' morphed through time and place to become the delicious chocolate bar we enjoy today. Along the way, the history of chocolate became both intriguing and delectable!

Frieda Looser has an MA (Hons) in History and is the author of *Fendall's Legacy, a history of Fendalton and Northwest Christchurch*. She was a Senior Tutor in the History Department at the University of Canterbury, tutoring and lecturing in a number of courses, and currently teaches in the UC Academic Skills Centre. Frieda was a contributor to the University's Community Education programme from 1998 to 2012, offering a wide range of courses exploring European, as well as New Zealand and local Canterbury history. She has led many history study tours to the British Isles and Europe. When the University disestablished Continuing Education in 2012, Frieda founded her own business and teaches history courses, and offers talks to U3A and other community groups.

Bus Trip Itinerary

Meeting point – Princess Margaret Hospital – 8:45am

Stop 1 – Victoria Park (Toilets)

Setting – Banks Peninsula volcanism, the Canterbury Plains, Christchurch City, and the Southern Alps. Examination of outcrop beneath the playground.

- Stop 2 John Jameson Lookout / Sign of the Bellbird Evolution of Banks Peninsula's volcanism. Large scale evidence within the landscape.
- Stop 3 Lyttelton Township Toilet / Coffee stop central township by main square.

Stop 5 – Evans Pass – Quarry

Layers within the volcano, cross cutting volcanic dykes. Use of materials – changes to the harbour.

Stop 6 – Sumner Beach – Lunch – Clock Tower End

After lunch a walk towards the breakwater end to examine the layers exposed in the cliff face.

- Stop 7 Heathcote Domain, Heathcote Valley *if time permits* Earthquake impacts, red zoning, rockfall, and mitigation
- Finish Princess Margaret Hospital 3pm

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Emergency Settings on Your Phone

You can add contacts to your phone which will be accessible when someone wants to dial an emergency number without unlocking your phone.

The following instructions, prepared by committee member Kath Varcoe are different for iPhones and Samsun phones. There may be other variations among different phone manufacturers and software.

On an iPhone

- 1. Open **contacts** on your phone
- 2. Select the person to be added as an emergency contact
- 3. Tap 'Add to Emergency Contacts'

On a Samsung phone

- 1. Open **Contacts** on your phone and tap your **name**.
- 2. Select Emergency contacts.
- 3. Tap the edit icon (pencil) on the right.
- 4. Tap **Add member** and select all the people on your list that you want to be your emergency contacts, then tap **Done**.
- 5. Save the selected members.
