Dr Levy was born in Liverpool and trained as a dentist at the London Hospital Medical College, qualifying in 1986. She worked in London for a few years in various dental practices part time, as well as getting a qualification in Forensic Odontology in 1988 (LHMC), followed by part-time work as an Honorary Lecturer at the London Hospital. She enjoys all aspects of dentistry but has a special interest in Paediatric Dentistry. Keen to keep up to date with current changes in dentistry, she attends many courses and lectures and is a member of various professional bodies including the NZ Dental Association, being a pastpresident of the local Canterbury Branch. The forensic side of her career is busy too. She is the Forensic Odontology Co-ordinator for Canterbury, West Coast and Nelson working for the Police and the Coroner. She was deployed to Phuket after the Boxing Day Tsunami to help identify the victims of the Tsunami and most recently was the DVI Dental Ante-Mortem and Reconciliation Co-ordinator for the Christchurch Earthquake.
