A previous NZ Winter Olympics Team physiotherapist, he has treated Olympic gold medallist rowers, alpine skiers, World Championship triathletes and members of the All Blacks. He has a special interest in how movement and strength impact our health and wellness. He is a passionate advocate for getting people away from their smartphones and computer screens and moving about in the great outdoors. He recently launched his book 'The Back Fix' which is in NZ bookstores now.
